First Reading: Proverbs 31:10-13, 19-20, 30-31

An encomium for a good and worthy wife, this passage from Proverbs extols all the virtues which a worthy wife possesses – fidelity, industriousness, skill, charity to the poor, and fear of the Lord.

Second Reading: 1 Thessalonians 5:1-6

Once again, Paul reassures the Thessalonians, who are anxious about the coming of Christ, that they need not fear being unprepared because they are “children of light.”

Gospel: Matthew 25:14-30

Jesus narrates the parable of the talents – in the story, the silver pieces given to the three men. Two of the men invest their coins and double their worth, but the third buries his coins in the ground and earns no return. The message of Jesus is that we must use to the fullest the talents we have received.

From Cardinal Dolan...

Dear friends in the Lord:

The Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD) has come to the aid of communities nationwide for more than 40 years in an effort to eradicate poverty. During World Youth Day, July 25, 2013, Pope Francis told us to “never tire of working for a more just world, marked by greater solidarity.” **CCHD** puts these words into action by funding housing, education, and the development of job opportunities.

Projects supported by **CCHD** move beyond providing basic human needs. They work to build healthy and sustainable futures for communities. For example, ten years ago, Boston’s Haley House began offering bakery training at the request of a few regular guests at the soup kitchen. Experiencing a tremendous demand, Haley House created a six-month course that includes customer relations and basic business principles. Haley House currently has 70 trainees who have completed the program and are now employed in the Boston area. It also runs cooking classes for at-risk teens and a transitional employment program that provides holistic, individual support to men and women re-entering the community after incarceration. Haley House is but a snap shot of the works of **CCHD** that seeks to create a strong local economy by building human relationships and by carrying on Christ’s mission “to bring glad tidings to the poor... liberty to captives... sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free” (Lk 4:18).

The special collection on the weekend of November 22nd & 23rd is the primary source of funding for **CCHD’s** antipoverty grants and education programs. Collection funds offer new hope each year to those living in poverty throughout the United States. And, 25 percent of the collection stays right here in our archdiocese to address poverty in our communities and defend the dignity of our neighbors.

As we express our gratitude to the Lord during the Thanksgiving holiday for all His blessings bestowed upon us, let’s think of those less fortunate than ourselves.

Please be as generous as you can be in helping **CCHD** defend human dignity by bringing Christian charity to those most in need.
