THIRTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: I Kings 17:10-16

Elijah asked a widow for a cup of water and a piece of bread. She told him she was almost out of flour, and that she and her son would soon starve. Elijah told her not to be afraid, as God had told him the jar of flour would not go empty. So she did as he had asked and prepared bread from the last of her flour. As God had said, her jar did not go empty, and she and her son had plenty to eat.

Second Reading: Hebrews 9:24-28

The high priests entered the sanctuary each year and offered a sacrifice, but not a sacrifice of their own blood. Just as people die once and are judged, Christ was offered up once for the sins of many.

Gospel: Mark 12:38-44

Jesus expressed disgust over the hypocrisy of some of the scribes for wanting special treatment from the people. He watched the wealthy put large contributions into the collection box, but explained that what they gave was surplus wealth, and not a real sacrifice. He told them the biggest donation was a small amount from a widow, because she had given up the only money that she had to live on.

From the Pastor's Desk...

My Dear Brothers and Sisters,

For the whole month of October I was a pilgrim in three continents. First I was in London for four days. Then I went to Nigeria for 10 days and then I spent 15 days in India visiting friends and family. During these days I experienced in abundance God's loving care and peoples' extreme kindness. I lacked nothing. The Providence of God is amazing and it takes good care of all who put faith in it. As I cherish these days, I truly express my gratitude to God and all my loving friends and family. But I am glad to be home now.

It is a singular privilege for me to enjoy the warm love of both of our priests' parents. I was feeling sad and apprehensive about how I would feel going home after my mom's passing. But God made me not to miss my mom's love because of the love they showered on me. Not only that, but Fr. Joselin's mom paid me the best compliment. After I visited them she called Fr. Joselin and told him that I looked younger this time.

I am so grateful to Fr. Charles and Fr. Joselin for taking good care of the parish during my absence. As I gather reports I understand, the place is still standing tall and there were not many block parties or night-outings. The reports are very encouraging. Good job Fr. Charles and Fr. Joselin.

As I travel around I observe people's faith and practices. I am very impressed with the way the people pray as a faith community in Nigeria. Every parish I went, I saw people come to Church to spend time with the Lord. It is amazing how they sing and are part of everything that goes on during prayer and Mass. They never give the impression that they are in a hurry to get it over with and leave. I wish we could be like that. Also at offertory every person in the church, from children to adults, all of them walk up to the Altar to place the offering in the collection box in front of the altar. Whether it is big or small they place it and go back to their seats. I know it is not practical for us but it is a sight to admire.

In India, I visited many families. Every home I was in, after night fall without fail, all the members gathered to pray the family rosary. The children sing hymns and read bible passages while the parents lead the mysteries of the rosary. We gather only to watch our favorite TV shows. Why not we gather to pray every night at least a decade of the rosary as a family? Don't forget, **the family that prays together stays together.**
