THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Nehemiah 8:2-4a, 5-6, 8-10

Ezra gathered the people and read to them from the book of the Law of God. He interpreted the law clearly, so that everyone understood what he had read. He then told them to go and rejoice in the Lord.

Second Reading: I Corinthians 12:12-30

Paul explains that a body is composed of many different parts, and that each part has its own purpose and is important. He compares this to the Church, describing how we are one body composed of many members. All members should show concern for each other and understand that we are all vital to the body as a whole.

Gospel: Luke 1:1-4, 4:14-21

Luke discusses his decision to write about the events he and the other disciples had witnessed. He begins by telling of Jesus reading a passage from the book of Isaiah, where the anointed one is portrayed. Jesus finished by telling the people that they had seen that passage fulfilled in their hearing.

From the Pastor's Desk...

My Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Stewardship is not anything new for our parishioners. From the beginning we have been supporting our parish in good measure with our time, talent and treasure. Otherwise our parish would not be in this glorious stage- marching towards the Hundredth year mark. But I must add that our stewardship is not limited to our own local church. It rightly extends beyond our local Church. It helps the Universal Church (Rome) and the Particular Church (Archdiocese of New York) in their needs. First and foremost, we unite with Holy Mother Church and constantly pray for her in our daily worship. Secondly we share God's blessings with all in need which is good stewardship.

Our Stewardship of the Universal Church:

Our generosity reaches to the Universal Church with a special Archdiocesan collection once a month to be sent to the Holy See in Rome so that they can support the particular churches in need in many parts of the world.

Our Stewardship of the Particular Church:

From our weekly collection, on a monthly basis we give a portion of it to the Archdiocese for the services it provides to our parish for the smooth administration of the parish structure. Added to that every year we make an appeal to support the Cardinal in his care of the entire diocese. We have been extremely generous in this. Even though we do not reach the goal set for us, we give every year nearly \$110,000.00. This year our goal is \$127,000.00. Let each of us try our best to give what we can to this year's Cardinal's Appeal which begins this Sunday.

The Cardinal's Appeal benefits the entire Archdiocese. The money collected from the Cardinal's Annual Appeal will be used for the various ministries of the Archdiocese. Much of the money is made available to support parishes that are in financial difficulty. The six areas funded are: Pastoral Offices and Programs, Support for Needy Parishes, The Departments of Education and Religious Education, Preparing the Clergy, Retired Priests and Religious, and Works of Charity.

Our Stewardship of the Local Church:

I am so proud of your constant generosity and your love for our parish and school. You support our Church with an average weekly contribution of nearly \$9,500.00. Thank you.

ENCYCLICAL ON THE ENVIRONMENT

Released on June 18, 2015, Pope Francis' encyclical, *Laudato Si': On Care for Our Common Home* highlights several basic teachings. First, the destruction of God's creation, and specifically climate change, is a moral issue. Second, there is an integral connection between our destruction of "Mother Earth" and the suffering of the poor, especially those in developing countries. Finally, immediate actions are required, by individuals, who must change their lives, and by the community of nations.
