**TWENTY-NINTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME**

**First Reading: Exodus 17:8-13**

Amalek and his people attacked the Israelites, so Moses instructed Joshua to lead some of the Israelites into battle the next day. While Moses kept his hands raised in prayer, the Israelites were winning. But when he put his hands down, they would begin to lose. So two others helped him keep his hands raised, and Joshua and the Israelites won the battle.

**Second Reading: 2 Timothy 3:14—4:2**

Paul tells Timothy that the Scriptures are inspired by God and are an excellent tool in teaching others about God's expectations of his people. Knowledge of the Scriptures, coupled with faith in Jesus, will lead many people to salvation. Paul urges Timothy to continue preaching the gospel, although this will sometimes be a difficult task.

**Gospel: Luke 18:1-8**

Jesus speaks about a corrupt judge who lacked respect for either God or man. A widow repeatedly asked him to settle a case in her favor. He finally settled the case, only because he grew weary of listening to her requests. Jesus points out that if even this corrupt judge eventually listened, then God, who is just, will certainly answer the pleas of his people.

## *From the Pastor's Desk...*

My Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Last Friday was the feast of Our Lady of the Rosary. Every year we celebrate this feast on October seventh and the Church reminds all families to pray the Rosary. I would like to witness that I would not have been a priest if not for the rosaries prayed by my parents. My Dad used to pray three rosaries daily. I try to pray one rosary daily and whenever I fail I justify it by saying I was busy and didn't get time. My Dad was a teacher, a public school principal, helped Mom to raise nine children, attended Mass daily and who freely tutored children who are weak in studies in our village every night. In the midst of all these he found time to pray three rosaries daily. Every evening at six when the Angelus bell rings in our parish Church, all of us have to come home for the family rosary and my brothers and sisters still keep up the tradition. After Dad's death I was home for vacation and as I was taking leave of my mother to come to Queen of Peace, as usual I knelt down to get her blessing and I said, "Mom pray for me and my parish." She lifted up the rosary in her right hand and said, "That is all I do the whole day." The best gifts we received from Dad were the beautiful shiny rosaries he would bring from Blessed Mother's shrine.

Christ gave us the Eucharist, the Church and the Sacraments. Mother Church gave us the Rosary as aid to simple souls to unite in prayer. It is easy to pray. Who can have difficulty in praying Our Fathers, Hail Marys and Glory bes?

Praying rosary helps us in two fold manner. It helps us to be united with God in prayer by repeatedly praying the greatest prayer Jesus taught his disciples to pray and Blessed Mother's surrender to God's will and cooperate with Him in saving the humanity. Secondly, praying the rosary helps us to fight against temptation and evil and to grow in virtues. My spiritual father in the seminary would say that when you are angry at someone, pray one Hail Mary before you answer back. If you are very angry say one decade of the rosary before you answer back. If you are very, very, very angry pray one rosary and then answer back. You will see how kind you have become in responding to an angry situation. Miracles will happen!
