TWENTY-SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Isaiah 5:1-7

This passage about the failure of the Lord's vineyard is a metaphor for the ingratitude of the people of Israel and Judah. In tones of sadness and rebuke, the Lord asks, "What more was there to do for my vineyard?"

Second Reading: Philippians 4:6-9

In a moving appeal to the Philippians, Paul exhorts them to embrace all that is pure, decent, and admirable; then God's peace will be theirs.

Gospel: Matthew 21:33-43

In another rebuke to the chief priests and the elders, Jesus recounts a parable in which the owner of a vineyard leases his vineyard to tenant farmers. When the owner sends his servants and even his son to claim his rightful share of the crops, the tenants kill all of them. With some bitterness, Jesus warns the chief priests that "the Kingdom of God will be taken away from you and given to people that will yield a rich harvest.

From the Pastor's Desk...

My Dear Brothers and Sisters,

I am so happy to be back from my home visit. In August I could not wait to go for a vacation but after a few days at home I couldn't wait to come back. The only time I felt like I could stay longer is the time I was visiting some of the parishes and evangelization work done in my former diocese and my brother, Bishop Francis' diocese. It brought back memories of my missionary work before I came to Queen of Peace. My mother and all family members, Bishop Francis, Fr. Das, Fr. Baskar and Fr. Ignatius Maria convey their love, best wishes and prayers to all of us.

On my way to India I visited Dublin and Belfast. I asked some of my friends there to drive me to the places where the fight between the Protestants and the Catholics took place. They were so kind to drive me around and explain in detail. I truly enjoyed my first visit to Ireland. Now there is peace and prosperity. If they could live in peace it is possible to bring peace in many conflict ridden areas of the world. We should pray every day for peace.

At home, my mother was so happy to see me but disappointed that her Bishop son did not come. After travelling 20 hours on the plane to see her, it hurts to know that I am still not her favorite and never will be. Last time when I was with her, her health was so bad that I did not think she would survive, but this time she is strong and manages herself very well. She went through eye surgery and now she can see. She prays the rosary the whole day and she told me that it is all for us. When I was there, I visited Fr. Joselin's home and his parents gave me the best dinner. They are worried that their son is so far away and they do not know how he lives. I told them that he is in the best parish in the whole wide world and with the most loving people on earth. I think they believe me. Next year I will visit Fr. Charles' parents on my way to India.

My brother Bishop Francis was very happy to see me and when I was there I visited some of his parishes and missions. This time I travelled along the river Ganges and the Himalayan Mountains. Some of those areas form part of my brother's diocese. I attended a festival in Fr. Das' parish. After going to that parish he now runs a school for nearly 2500 children and already converted nearly 600 people to the faith. He has no church yet for them and is in the process of building one. He fondly remembers all of us and sends his good wishes. Finally I am so grateful to Fr. Charles, Fr. Joselin, Msgr. Whalen and the deacons for taking good care of the parish.
