From the Pastor's Desk...

My Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Even though I wrote one full column on my visit to India, I still would like to share two more experiences. First, during the whole time I did not watch TV or use computer at all. It was a great experience. Not only I did not miss TV or computer, but it helped me to be with people and be present to them. What an uplifting experience! Try to minimize TV and electronic gadgets in your life and in your children's life, you will become close to your loved ones.

Second, every family I was in for the night together prayed the Rosary at night, especially children leading the prayer. October is the month of the Holy Rosary. We Catholics are so privileged to have a prayer like Rosary. It is the easiest prayer to recite and it is the loveliest prayer to contemplate with our Mother her Son's saving act for mankind. St. John Paul II said once, "**With the Rosary, the Christian people sits at the school of Mary and is led to contemplate the beauty on the face of Christ and to experience the depths of his love.**"

Maryknoll Bishop James E. Walsh has given one of the best testimonies on praying Rosary. When he was a missionary in China he was arrested by the communists in 1958 and sentenced to twenty years in prison. He spent twelve years of his prison sentence in isolation. He couldn't say Mass, couldn't recite the Breviary, but he had his ten fingers to count the Hail Marys on and that is all he did. Some days he said six Rosaries, other days, twelve or even eighteen. He testifies that the Rosary was a "never-failing life line all through my twelve prison years." Whenever he felt oppressed by any trouble, the Rosary afforded him hope and consolation. Instead of worrying about people, he offered his "Rosary ministry" for them.

During my visit to India, I travelled with my brother Bishop Francis visiting his parishes. Even if it is a trip for an hour he would start the Rosary and we prayed for various intentions. He was always particular to include us every time we prayed. My 8th grade nephew one night led the family Rosary and he offered the second decade for our parish. I was truly impressed. I am so happy to know that our school children recite the Rosary this month every day. Pray the Rosary every day. Entrust yourself and your family to the loving protection of our Blessed Mother. She will not allow any danger of body and soul to come near you.
