First Reading: Isaiah 35:4-7a

Second Reading: James 2:1-5

From the Pastor's Desk...

My Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Tomorrow we celebrate as Labor Day. Most people think that it is one last chance to party and close the summer. I have nothing against having a great party and fun. Have a great Labor Day celebration and enjoy it with family and friends. But do not forget to pray for all the workers and those who are unemployed and those who are seeking meaningful employment. Archbishop Thomas G. Wenski of Miami Chairman, Committee on Domestic Justice and Human Development United States Conference of Catholic Bishops issued Labor Day Statement for all Catholics to reflect, pray and practice in life. I am giving you the highlights of it and you can read the full text online.

“Creating sufficient, decent work that honors the dignity of families is a necessary component of the challenge facing all Catholics and it is the Catholic way.”

“We must not resign ourselves to a ‘new normal’ with an economy that does not provide stable work at a living wage for too many men and women,”

“We are in need of a profound conversion of heart at all levels of our lives.” Archbishop Wenski challenged Catholics to “recommit ourselves to our brothers and sisters around the world in the human family, and build systems and structures that nurture family formation and stability in our homes and neighborhoods.

Archbishop Wenski noted that even though work is meant for the sake of family, “Wage stagnation has increased pressures on families, as the costs of food, housing, transportation, and education continue to pile up.” He added that “the violation of human dignity is evident in exploited workers, trafficked women and children, and a broken immigration system that fails people and families desperate for decent work and a better life.

Archbishop Wenski said that, in *Laudato Si'*, Pope Francis challenges people to see the connections between human labor, care for creation, and honoring the dignity of the “universal family, a sublime communion which fills us with a sacred, affectionate and humble respect.

Let me extend a warm welcome to Ms. Margaret Annunciata, our School Principal, our teachers, children and all our parish families after a happy and safe summer break.

Father Anderson earned his Doctor of Ministry Degree from Saint Mary's Seminary and University in Baltimore and his Doctorate in Sacred Theology from Duquesne University in Pittsburgh.
