FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT

First Reading: Isaiah 43:16-21

God says not to remember the events from long ago, but to focus on the things he plans to do next. He also claims he will again help his chosen people when they need him.

Second Reading: Philippians 3:8-14

Paul describes knowledge of Jesus as more important than knowledge of the Old Law. He wishes to share in the power of Jesus' resurrection, and speaks of concentrating on the finish line of the race with salvation as the prize to be won.

Gospel: John 8:1-11

Jesus preached forgiveness of sin, but in the old law those accused of adultery were to be stoned. So the Pharisees tried to trap Jesus and brought a woman accused of adultery to him, asking him what he would do to her. Jesus asked that one without sin cast the first stone, and then all of the elders left. Jesus told the woman that he did not condemn her, but warned her to avoid such sin in the future.

From the Pastor's Desk...

My Dear Brothers and Sisters,

I love priestly fraternity. Whether it is attending the solemn celebration of the Chrism Mass with the Bishop and all the priests during Holy Week or simple gatherings to discuss pastoral and priestly concerns, I always make it a point to attend and participate to nurture one another. I enjoyed it in India when I was serving there and now I enjoy it very much here in the Archdiocese. Officially and unofficially we have plenty of opportunities to gather and help one another in many ways. One such opportunity is the recollections held in the seminary during Advent and Lent. After Cardinal Dolan became Archbishop he himself preaches these recollections whenever possible for him. On February 24th we had the priestly Lenten recollection for 2016, preached by His Eminence. It was an amazing day. Nearly 120 priests gathered in the seminary and His Eminence spoke about prayer and friendship with Jesus and I thought some of the points he shared would be good for all of us.

He began with Mother Theresa, when asked by one of the Cardinals what she was going to talk about to the huge crowd in Rome; she simply said that she didn't know exactly, but definitely something about Jesus. He asked all of us priests to talk about Jesus especially to brother priests because he is the center of our life. Do we talk about Jesus often to one another especially to our own family members?

He told us that St. Peter loved having and doing things rather than being with Jesus. He pointed out that St. Peter was focused on taking care of Jesus but Jesus wanted Peter to let him take care. Can we let go of ourselves and let Jesus to take care of us?

I loved the way he elaborated the prayer life of priests. He told us that prayer is the willingness to waste time with God. We complain if the priest is two minutes longer than usual 45 minutes Mass. Do you think you would be willing to waste time with God because it is prayer?
