**First Reading: Wisdom 11:22—12:2**

In this reading, we are reminded of the love God feels toward every creature, or else he would not have created them. God shows mercy on our sins and hopes we will repent and have faith in him.

**Second Reading: 2 Thessalonians 1:11—2:2**

Paul tells the Thessalonians that God will make them worthy of his call, so that they can be glorified in Christ. Paul also tells them he is unsure when Christ will come again, but urges them not to believe people who falsely state that Jesus has returned.

**Gospel: Luke 19:1-10**

Zacchaeus, the wealthy chief tax collector in Jericho, was very excited when Jesus came to town and asked to stay with him. People were angry that Jesus would go to a sinner's home. Zacchaeus then told Jesus he planned to give half of his belongings to the poor, and repay any person he had cheated. Jesus was delighted since his mission was "to search out and save what was lost."

## *From the Pastor's Desk...*

My Dear Brothers and Sisters,

First, let me honestly thank Rev. Michael Sullivan who gave the Parish Mission during Columbus Day Weekend. It was truly a very inspiring and compelling preaching on God's love and care for all of us. He wrote to me a note stating that he enjoyed being with us and preaching the Mission in our parish. Thanks to all who attended the Mission and contributed to his love offering. I truly benefited from it and still wallow in God's infinite love every day. Try to wallow in God's love for a few minutes every day and you will see how delightful it is!

This past week, I was at the Annual Pastors' Conference for 4 days in Spring Lake, New Jersey with nearly 89 Pastors from our beloved Archdiocese. This is one chance for all the Pastors to learn from various renewal courses and from one another. The best learning takes place not during those classes and lectures but at the dinner table when we share our lives in the parish with one another. For instance, one evening at the dinner table I was sharing that I feel sad at Mass because some of my parishioners as soon as they receive Communion either leave the Church or go and stand at the back to run out as soon as the final blessing is given. They do not take time to give thanks to God or allow me to spend a moment to thank God. You have no idea how surprised I was to hear that everyone has the same problem.

Fr. Joselin's religious order, the Missionaries of Mary Immaculate is willing to help staff some of the parishes in the Archdiocese especially in Sullivan County where the Franciscan priests are leaving. Hence the Order has requested Fr. Joselin to go and stay in St. Anthony of Padua & St. Thomas Aquinas parish in Yulan with Fr. George LaGrutta and see the possibility of it. If it works out Fr. Joselin will be able to administer a parish and some more priests from his order can join him in assisting the nearby parishes. Then, it would be a loss for our parish but a blessing for those parishes. Until official appointment is made from the part of the Archdiocese and the Religious Order, Fr. Joselin will be free to be with both parishes. Keep him in your prayers.

I am leaving this week for a three week visit to India for my niece's wedding on the 4<sup>th</sup> of November. During my absence Fr. Charles and the Deacons will take care of our parish.
