From the Pastor's Desk ...

My Dear Brothers and Sisters,

I am so glad to inform you that Fr. Charles arrived home safely and enjoying his home visit. I had requested his bishop to send a priest to cover our parish during his home visit. His Bishop Most Rev. Joseph Bagobiri agreed to send his Cathedral Pastor for a month to help us. His name is Fr. Patrick and he is a classmate of Fr. Charles. Fr. Patrick informed me that he has a big fund- raising event going on in his parish in June and he will be able to come only in July. He will be with us on July 4th. Meanwhile Fr. Joslin got his visa renewed and he needs to leave the country and reenter. So, he requested a priest from his order to come and take his place and continue working with him in Sullivan County. They send him Fr. David and when Fr. Joslin learned that I am alone here he asked Fr. David to help us until Fr. Patrick arrives. In every way, we are blessed and thanks to Fr. Joslin and Bishop Joseph.

I think some updates are due now regarding the Renovation Projects and the "Renew and Rebuild" Campaign. The Archdiocesan Insurance, Catholic Mutual stepped in to address the water related damages in the Chapel sacristy Fr. Hopkins Hall bathroom and storage room during the heavy rain last month.

For the elevator project, the Archdiocesan Building Division Aramark Company which oversees the work has examined the three bids that were submitted to us and chosen Cro-International for the job. It has prepared a RFA (Request for Authorization) for \$791,379.00. Very soon after examining our finances the request will be granted and the work will begin. Meanwhile repairing the two floors of the old convent building will be completed soon. During the renovation period, we will face many inconveniences. Please be accommodative of all inconvenience. We need to have all our structures in best shape when we reach the Centenary celebration of our parish in 2022.

"Renew and Rebuild" campaign is very slow. So far we have realized only \$72,000.00. That is not even enough for this year's Cardinal's Appeal of \$123,000.00. I am expecting some money from this campaign for the renovation projects. Otherwise we will end up with a huge debt. Please be generous. Happy summer!

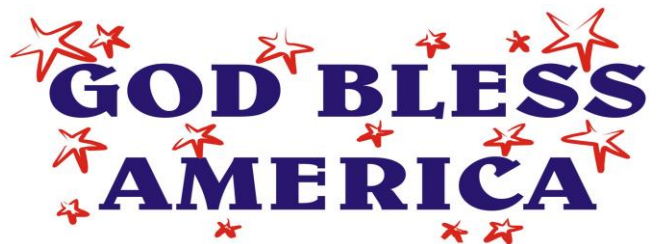

A GENTLE REMINDER

As we approach the warmer weather it would be good to be mindful of the special circumstances that our summer living presents us. Our society in general has become much more casual. "Dress down days" at places of work are common. However, we cannot equate our culture's casualness with how we should dress for our liturgies. As Catholics, we tend to dress down when we attend Church while members of other faiths seem to dress up. Our attire should be in keeping with the reverence for the liturgies that we attend.

Certainly, the summer, especially at beach areas, might be an occasion for some casual dress. It would be a good rule of thumb, however, to keep in mind, "Would we appear at any important function dressed in this way?" Beach and recreation attire should not be Church attire. Common sense rules of modesty should apply when we decide how to present ourselves in Church. **Also, we ask that you remember to turn off your cell phone and properly dispose of chewing gum before entering the Church.** Thank you for your thoughtfulness in this regard.

ENCYCLICAL ON THE ENVIRONMENT

Central to Pope Francis' environmental encyclical, *Laudato Si'*, is his call for a universal "culture of encounter," or dialogue. Dialogue between science and religion, between the market economy and true human fulfillment, between the overdeveloped North and suffering communities in the South, is essential to "caring for our common home." Let us pray for conversion to such a dialogical spirituality, even as we live it out by buying less and demanding limits to greenhouse gas emissions from our government.
