**TWENTY-EIGHTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME**

**First Reading: Isaiah 25:6-10a**

This passage describes the new Jerusalem as a heavenly banquet on the mountain with the Lord God wiping away all tears.

**Second Reading: Philippians 4:12-14, 19-20**

In simple, direct words, Paul thanks the Philippians for alleviating his hardships. He stresses, though, that he is as accustomed to poverty as to abundance and finds all his strength in Christ.

**Gospel: Matthew 22:1-14**

Once more speaking to the chief priests and the elders, Jesus relates the parable of the wedding banquet. A king, preparing a wedding banquet for his son, summons all the invited guests. When, after several invitations, no guests arrive, the King commands his servants to "go out into the byroads and invite anyone you come upon." Again, Jesus warns the elders, "the invited are many, the elect are few."

# Parish Council Report...

Our Lady Queen of Peace Parish Council met on Wednesday, September 21st, 2017. Our Pastor, Rev. Pancrose Kalist opened the meeting with a prayer at 7:10 pm. Dan Clifford, the council's chairman, welcomed everyone.

Father Pancrose spoke about the Eucharistic Ministers' meeting that took place on September 14th and the need to comply with the Archdiocesan mandates. Eucharistic Ministers will be certified to serve for a three-year term. Names have been submitted to Monsignor Finn, Dean of Staten Island.

He also spoke about calling all parishioners to join in a spiritual revival of parish life as we enter into preparations for our 100th Anniversary as a parish. Our Parish will celebrate its' 100th Anniversary on October 14th 2022. Father will begin preaching about the need for us to join in a spiritual revival of the parish and invite parishioners to get involved in the parish organizations and lay ministries.

Father Pancrose spoke of the recent changes in the school. Enrollment is down. The decreased enrollment has caused the Archdiocese to temporarily halt some of the renovations that are planned for the convent building to use it for class rooms. Our Lady Queen of Peace school may not need the convent building for classrooms because of low enrolments. So the elevator and other planned renovations need to be done after evaluating the future use of it. The parish and the Archdiocese will explore alternative uses for the building like leasing it to some organization to gain income for the parish. In the meantime, only necessary interior work will continue. Father Pancrose presented an update of parish finances. Monies raised for the convent renovation are set aside in an account until alternative plans can be made.

The representatives of the various parish organizations presented their reports. A discussion about ideas that we can use to increase parishioner involvement took place. A Welcoming Committee, monthly hospitality events were among ideas that were discussed.

Father Charles closed the meeting with a prayer at 8:30pm.

# Saint Teresa of Avila

Feast Day – October 15

Teresa was the daughter of noble parents in Spain. When she was only seven years of age she and her little brother liked to read stories from the lives of saints. One of their games was playing “hermit” in their father’s garden. When Teresa was still quite young, she became crippled by disease and was unable to walk. She prayed to St. Joseph, who cured her.

Teresa lost her mother when she was twelve. She begged the Mother of God to be her mother. Five years after her mother’s death she joined the Carmelite Order. She built many new convents.

By a life of prayers, work, and sacrifice Teresa brought many souls to Jesus. Her many writings show her great love of God. She wrote: **“Let nothing trouble you, let nothing make you afraid. All things pass away. God never changes. Patience obtains everything. God alone is enough.”** She died on October 4, 1582 after she had a vision of Jesus and many saints.
