Gospel: Matthew 22:34-40

Matthew recounts the incident in which a lawyer, seeking to entrap Jesus, asks, "Teacher, which commandment of the law is the greatest?" With simplicity and authority, Jesus responds that the first commandment is to love God with one's entire being; the second is to love one's neighbor as oneself.

Preparation for Parish Centenary - 1

My Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Our parish has already marched into its 96th year two weeks ago. I do not know how many of you realize the importance of this fact. Those who are born and brought up in this parish and those who are long time parishioners may feel the gravity of it because you celebrated your sacraments and grew up as a faith community and built it up with your life and sacrifices. Some of you who have joined the parish recently may not feel the same way as long-time parishioners. No matter at what point you joined the parish we are all now one family proudly looking forward to its centenary.

Two weeks ago, I spoke at all the weekend Masses to bring awareness and prepare for it. I am sure some of you must be thinking what is he talking about? we have plenty of time. Five years is not a lot of time to prepare ourselves for the centenary celebration. I can't believe that it is already 10 years since I came here for my second innings. So, let us put our hearts and minds in getting ready for this from now onwards. In my homily that day I reminded you of the great vision, dedication and hard work of Rev. Fr. John Hopkins (Founder) and many other devoted priests who followed him. In gratitude to all these dedicated priests who gave us this great parish as a blessing let us live our faith and renew our commitment to march beyond 100 years as a living and vibrant faith community where our children and grandchildren can be nurtured in faith.

Let me propose a broad plan outline for our parish renewal during these years as our preparation for now and I promise to write once every month in this regard to aid our progress.

Five Year Plan for the Parish Renewal

First three years - Spiritual Renewal focused on each individual, each family and the entire parish in faith, celebration of sacraments, prayer, virtues, morals, family life and community building.

Fourth Year – Renovation of our physical facilities: Church, Chapel, School, Rectory, Old Convent and Parking Lots.
