**OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST,
KING OF THE UNIVERSE**

First Reading: Ezekiel 34: 11-12, 15-17

This passage beautifully describes how the Lord God, as shepherd, will tend his flock. He will rescue those who are lost, bring back those who stray, heal the sick, and “pasture” all.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 15:20-26, 28

Paul once again stresses the significance of Christ’s resurrection in the total divine plan, emphasizing that Christ’s rising means that those who believe in him will also rise after death. Christianity, he argues, is meaningless if it concerns only this life on earth, in the end, even death will be destroyed, and “God will be all in all.”

Gospel: Matthew 25:31-46

With words both poetic and vivid, Jesus tells the disciples that since he is present in all people, whatever they do to “one of my least brothers” they do to him; and whatever they fail to do to his “least,” they fail to do to him.

From the Pastor's Desk ...

My Dear Brothers and Sisters,

We keep in touch with our former parishioners who move to other parishes and continue sending them our parish bulletins. Once in a while we hear from them and they share news from their parishes. Recently I got this bulletin piece from St. Raphael Catholic Church in Maryland sent by our beloved former parishioner John & Arlene Donovan who moved a year ago to St. Raphael's parish in Maryland.

TITHING

I can still remember the day my husband & I decided to start tithing. We were living in a very small basement apartment in a friend's house. Our previous landlord was raising our rent several hundred Dollars per year. We knew that money would be better spent on a mortgage. We were looking for a house closer to our parish. The market at the time was fast. Homes were being listed and sold within a week and our price range was too low. We had been house hunting for eight months, and the only homes we could afford were foreclosed, or dilapidated homes. One day we came back from seeing one of them and I was in tears. That is when my husband said something radical, "Honey, I think we need to start tithing." Needless to say I wasn't very charitable-what an insane idea! We lived on a single income, had bills, debt and now we were going to give what little we had and more to God? God knew our financial problems & obligations and He certainly didn't need our 10%

"You are right. He doesn't. but we're in need of His grace and maybe this will help," my husband said. I thought about it, prayed about it and after a few days of more frustrating house hunting we surrendered to God and started tithing.

Three months had passed and with it came bills, car repairs and more dilapidated homes to see. Still the first check we wrote when we did our budget was to God and there was always enough to put food on the table and pay for the essentials. Then one morning, I got an email for a listing of a 4 bedroom, 3 bath home in our price range, I called my agent and we went to see it that morning. My mouth dropped because I couldn't believe how everything about this home was what I always wanted and it was listed at a low price! Best of all, it was only 5 minutes from our parish's! We immediately signed the contract and started praying. Bidding wars were typical and we found out that afternoon that 3 other contracts were offered to the owners. The next day our realtor called and they accepted our contract! That was one of the many miracles of our home. Because the realtor was not from the area, she underpriced the house by \$30,000. The other contracts offered more money, but the owners wanted ours because we were the first ones to see it. And to make sure we knew that this was a sign from God, the day our contract was accepted was on the feast day of our parish.

Eight years have passed since we've started tithing and God never ceases in generosity. My husband's job brought

Him several promotions and now he is a Unit Chief in the government. Our children are blessed to go to amazing Catholic schools because of the generosity of grants from their schools. Not only do we have food on the table and a roof over our heads, God provides more than enough for us and is more generous to us than we were to ourselves eight years ago. Yes, the temptations come, but looking back at where we were and where God has taken us, there is no doubt in our hearts & minds that the first check we write will be to Him. Another miracle that tithing has given our family is freedom. Realizing that all belongs to God and we are stewards meant to do His will, gives us a great sense of peace. We understand now that God cannot give you grace unless you open the door for Him to come into your life. Tithing is about trust – trusting that God can never be outdone in generosity, trusting that He will take care of you & your needs, but most of all trusting in His will and that His will is Love.

God is always generous to us and let us reflect it in life.

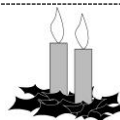
