FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT

First Reading: Isaiah 63:16b-17, 64:2-7

In this straightforward psalm, the people acknowledge their sinful ways, yet plead that their Creator might reveal himself to them. They ask God to remember, not their sins, but that “We are all the work of your hands.”

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 1:3-9

Paul explains to the Corinthians that they are specially favored by God who has sent his only Son to them. He reminds us all that it was through God’s grace that we have been called to kinship with Christ.

Gospel: Mark 13:33-37

Just as a servant watching over the master’s house does not know when he will return, we do not know the hour of the Second Coming. Mark reminds us of the warning from Jesus to always be on guard, for we know not the day nor the hour.

From the Pastor's Desk ...

My Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Last Sunday, we celebrated the Solemnity of Christ the King and ended the liturgical year. This Sunday we light the First Candle of the Advent wreath and begin the new liturgical year. We are given four weeks to prepare for the celebration of Christmas. The birth of Christ took place historically 2000 years ago. Every year on December 25th we commemorate this historical event as Christmas. As Disciples of Christ our Lord and Savior, these four weeks of preparation are not just for the celebration of that event. It is much more than that.

Let us use the season of advent as a time to prepare ourselves on three different levels: 1. Christ who came. 2. Christ who is coming daily and 3. Christ who will come.

1. Christ who came: Of course, Advent is truly a time to prepare for a lovely celebration of the birth of Christ as a historical event with all our family and friends. That is where our shopping, gift giving, mailing Christmas cards, tree lighting, putting up Christmas manger and stars, hosting lovely family dinners and million other special things we get done during Christmas.

2. Christ who comes to us daily: Advent is also a preparation for the Risen Christ who comes to us on a daily basis in all our life situations. Many of us live our lives blind to the truth that Christ comes to us daily in our human encounters. Last Sunday's Gospel of Judgement day told us that when you did it to the least of my brothers you did it to me. Every person we encounter is created in the image and likeness of God and deserves to be treated as such. Let this season of Advent be a time to realize this truth and ready always to welcome the Christ whom we encounter in others beginning with our family members.

3. Christ who will come: Advent is also a preparation for the Second coming of our Lord to judge and reward us with eternal life. This is where our faith and worship gatherings come in. At every Mass we proclaim: Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again. Let us deepen our faith and relationship with Christ through sacraments, prayers, and scripture. Let us repent for our failures and sins always and be ready.

I wish and pray that every family and every individual in our parish will spend this Advent season to prepare in all three levels and enjoy all the blessings of a very Blessed Christmas.

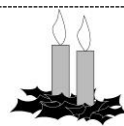
Advent Wreath

One of the most common symbols used during Advent is the Advent wreath, usually made of evergreen branches formed into a circle. It holds four candles: three purple (or dark blue) and one pink. The purple candles symbolize the time of preparation and are lit at the beginning of the first, second, and fourth Sundays of Advent. The pink candle, lit at the beginning of the third week of Advent, symbolizes our focus on rejoicing during this penitential season. There is a similar Sunday in Lent.

Many families make a small Advent wreath for use at home. Although the candles on the wreath in church are lit only on Sundays, the candles on the family's wreath usually are lit each night of the week, accompanied with a variety of prayers or rituals. Some families place a white or light-colored candle in the middle of the Advent wreath on Christmas Eve to symbolize the coming of the Christ Child. This candle symbolizes the connection between the Old and the New Testaments. Whatever is chosen, prayers and rituals should be appropriate and relevant to all members of the family.
