THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Jonah 3:1-5, 10

From the Pastor's Desk ...

My Dear Brothers and Sisters,

The Joyful Christmas season is behind us. We have entered into the Ordinary Time of the Liturgical year in a hurry. Before it is too late, let me express my gratitude for all the blessings we received during Christmas. Our Church sanctuaries here as well as in Our Lady of Lourdes looked heavenly. It captivated me so much as I sat in front of it to pray and meditate. Under the guidance of Mrs. Barbara Orleman lots of people worked together to decorate beautifully here and under the guidance of Ray Eger and Michael Quagliano at Our Lady of Lourdes. They all deserve our applause. Job well done!!!

I need to thank all our parishioners who attended Mass during this Christmas even in the inclement weather and worshiped the New Born King. I want to express my heartfelt gratitude for your great contribution to our church for Christmas which amounted to almost \$25,000.00. God bless you all for your dedication to Christ and our church.

I also take this chance to express my gratitude to all our parishioners who sent cards and gifts to me for Christmas. I couldn't thank anyone individually because of the way those two weeks went for me. I have to say God took me through those two weeks in a super-sonic speed. I do not know whether I was breathing as I was journeying on God's back as His back bag! Just before Christmas week my youngest brother became seriously ill and admitted in ICU with all his internal organs collapsing. My older brother Most Rev. Francis Kalist came to be with him immediately after his January 1st Holy Mass for the Solemnity of Mother of God. He informed me that I need to come and be with him as he was dying. I kind of hesitated and continued to pray. On Thursday January 4th when we had the heavy snow storm he called and informed me that it would be only a day or two. I replied that there was a snow storm and 3500 flights are cancelled and I do not think I would be able to make it. I prayed and left it in God's hands. God never disappoints anyone. Next thing I know is that I got into a plane on Sunday after two Masses, arrived at the hospital on Monday midnight, saw him for two minutes. I requested the doctors to move him to a hospice room from the ICU so that his wife and children could spent time with him. My bishop brother and I stayed with him in the hospital until Thursday evening at 6:30 pm when he changed his residence to heaven with God and saints. We celebrated the funeral on Friday at 11 am and at 1:30 pm I got into a plane and back in Queen of Peace the next day. I was just on God's back as His back bag when he carried me and brought me back. Forty hours in the air, 4 sleepless days and nights in the hospital, a funeral, all in 6 days' time and I am still functioning normal. Praise God for his marvels to his faithful ones.
